Sleep and Headaches

Sleep disorders and headache often go hand in hand, and it has been observed that half of the patients seen in a typical headache clinic have co-existing sleep problems.

While not absolute, headaches due to sleep disturbance sometimes do have different characteristics in terms of quality, timing, location, duration and response to medications.

- 1) schedule 8 hours of sleep each night
2) not to read, watch tv or listen to music in bed
3) use visualization techniques to shorten sleep onset
4) limit fluid intake beginning two hours before bed to ensure sounder sleep
5) move dinner time to 4 hours before bed to ensure sounder sleep
6) discontinue naps

Keep sleep issue in mind when treating headaches can often make headache management easier, and lowering medication usage. It can also lower overall morbidity and mortality.
